Welcome from the Principal

Hamilton High School is a Catholic voluntary all-boys secondary school. The school was founded by Mr. Seán Hamilton. The school building and grounds are owned by Mr. Pádraig Hamilton who is a Trustee while the school is run by a Board of Management. Five new classrooms are open with plans for future development afoot, including the provision of a P.E. facility and a canteen.

The day-to-day management of the school is carried out by Senior Management, the school's Principal, Mr. Eugene O'Brien, and the school Deputy Principal, Mr. Damian Mitchell. The middle management team act as Year Heads for each year group and liaise with staff, students and parents. Class tutors are assigned to each class and work with Year Heads in the pastoral care of students.

The philosophy of the school is to encourage cooperation between all partners in education as well as to develop close links with the local community. Our students are encouraged to become life-long, independent learners. In our 80th year the school is proud to have been recognised as a centre of academic excellence with a strong emphasis on teaching and learning.

Special Educational Needs (SEN)

Special Educational Teaching Support/Additional Teaching Support is provided to students who require such support based on their assessed needs.

The Special Education Needs Organiser (SENO)/National Council for Special Education (NCSE) make decisions regarding granting access to Special Needs Assistant (SNA) support and Assistive Technology. For students who require SNA support and/or Assistive Technology, following consultation with parent(s)/guardian(s) and/or at the request of the parent(s)/guardian(s), the school makes an application to the SENO/NCSE on behalf of the student. This application is accompanied by relevant professional report(s), for example an Educational Psychologist report, Occupational Therapy report etc; and by relevant information provided by, as appropriate, student, parent(s)/guardian(s) and/or school.

Reasonable Accommodations at the Certificate Examinations (RACE) facilitate students in accessing the Junior and Leaving Certificate Examinations who would have difficulty accessing the exams or communicating what they know due to a visual, hearing, physical and/or learning difficulty. The State Examinations Commission (SEC)/RACE provides Reasonable Accommodations for students with a number of complex special educational needs including learning difficulties, temporary/permanent physical, medical, sensory, hearing, visual, sensory, emotional, behavioural or other conditions. An example of a Reasonable Accommodation would be use of a word processor. Currently, the RACE application process takes place during Third Year (Junior Certificate Year) and Sixth Year (Leaving Certificate Year).

Parent(s)/Guardian(s) are asked to provide information regarding their son's special education needs including professional reports when completing enrolment application forms in order to ensure that Hamilton High School can provide each student with the necessary supports they require.

Curriculum Provision

Junior Cycle Programme

Students will complete a six year education cycle. Students must complete a three year junior cycle. Transition Year is compulsory for all students. Senior Cycle consists of a two year course of study. All staff will work with students and their families to ensure each student attends school regularly and punctually. First year students have the opportunity to study **all** of the subjects listed below.

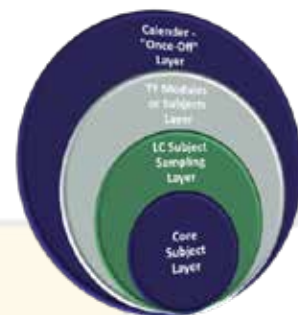
Irish, English (New Junior Cycle Award), Mathematics (Project Maths), Science, Business Studies, Religious Education, Physical Education, Civic Social and Political Education (CSPE), Social Personal and Health Education (SPHE), Information Technology, History, Geography, French, German

Classes are non-streamed when students come into First Year but at the beginning of Second Year classes are sometimes banded for Maths, English and Irish. This allows students to be placed in classes (for these three subjects) that suit their ability level. All other subjects are taught at mixed-ability level. The school community, particularly the Guidance Counsellor and Year Head, will assist new students settling in and First Year students in their transition from primary school to secondary school. **Students choose one modern language, either French or German, at the end of first year.**

The Junior Cycle curriculum is complemented, in so far as possible, by school field trips and outings: Science Field trip to Fota Wildlife Park, Educational school trip organised by the Year Head, Geography field trip, visits to the theatre and the local & wider community for project work.

Transition Year Programme

Transition Year at Hamilton High School is compulsory and offers students a broader educational experience. Students engage in a wide range of activities and are given the opportunity to sample subjects offered at Leaving Certificate. In Transition Year, we place particular emphasis on the development of each student into a mature and caring citizen. We aim to equip students with the life skills and qualifications that will enable them to lead a happy and fulfilling life. Students are encouraged to become independent lifelong learners where they take greater responsibility for their own learning and decision-making. Parental support is vital to the success of Transition Year and with this continued support we endeavour to improve our Transition Year programme annually. The Transition Year Co-ordinator meets with parents early in the first term to outline the proposed programme for the year.

Overall, in terms of Curriculum Provision, the purpose of Hamilton High School is to equip students with the necessary life skills and qualifications to become lifelong, independent learners as well as mature, responsible and caring citizens.

Suggestions for Parents

- **Be positive:** encourage your son to reach his potential and praise his efforts. Talk to your son about the importance of education. Encourage your son to become involved in school activities.
- **Make sure homework is done:** if there is a problem with homework, send a note in the Student Journal/ contact the Subject Teacher/Year Head.
- **Be organised:** Help your son to organise his homework schedule and study schedule. Encourage him to get his school bag/lunch/P.E. gear etc. ready the night before.
- **Ensure your son goes to bed at a reasonable time:** students must have a note if they are late and may incur a sanction if they are persistently late.
- **Appointments:** please try to arrange medical/dental/speech therapy, etc. appointments outside of school time. If, unavoidably, your son has an appointment during school time, give him a note to sign out and return him to school if he is medically fit.
- **Correspondence:** check your son's Student Journal for notes from teachers and any letters from school re meetings/early finishes, etc.
- **Attendances/absences:** ensure your son attends school every day, especially on Parent/Teacher meeting/staff meetings days, Mondays, Fridays, birthdays, etc.
- Refer to parent(s) procedures for reporting absences. If your son is sick in hospital or has an accident, please inform the school. If your son is sick in school, ask him to tell the Year Head/Deputy Principal and you will be contacted.
- **Family Issues:** reassure your son, continue with his regular routine, e.g. attending school, doing homework. Please inform the Principal if there are any issues which may be affecting your son's performance in school.
